I had a young man visiting the States from Saudi Arabia on business in March. He needs our prayers as he is seeking more information on a relationship with Christ. He came to see me on his trip to Houston. He drove 4 hours just to have lunch with me and turn around and drive back to Houston. He brought a fellow Saudi who is a national from the country of Chad. This was my first opportunity to meet someone from Chad. I also am happy to report that one of the young men from Iraq that I met in Dallas for the first time a year ago, has become a new believer. He has other family members living in North Dallas that are seeking. Pray for their eyes to be open and their hearts to be receptive.

Our web page is constantly under construction and is being used to spread the news around the world. We have had inquires from over 70 countries around the world. Pray for continued hits on our web site at lighttwentyfour.org. We had our first Bibles going into a Muslim country that are awaiting distribution. Pray that these copies will be used to bring people into the kingdom

Our ministry depends on word of mouth and referrals. If you have friends or Church families that are interested in outreach to restricted access nations feel free to give us a recommendation. Blessings to all of you as you serve the King on your field. If your church has restricted access nation people living nearby and you would like to start a ministry I am always up for helping.
